As of 2020, the Roster Sizes for Men's Wrestling were NCAA 30.7, NAIA 31.0 &, Total 30.77. NCAA Roster Size has Grown 41% Since 1981-82.

Do all NCAA D1 teams have scholarships? Does D3 have scholarships?

There are at least 9 NCAA D1 Men's Wrestling Teams that have NO Athletic GIA's.

- The 3 Military Academies and the 6 Ivies that have Men's Wrestling DO NOT offer Athletic Scholarships.
- There could be more schools in D1 that do the same.
- No GIA's in NCAA D3.

What is the maximum number of men's wrestlers that could have GIA's by classification?

If all schools that offered GIA's gave the max Number (Xanadu not Reality) of GIA's there would be 1,947 Total GIA's Across Men's Wrestling

NCAA D1 has the Largest Decline in Teams and Participants by far Since the Max Days in the 80's.

Most of the Growth in NCAA Men's Wrestling has come from D2 & D3.

- There are more Announced NCAA Men's Wrestling Teams in 2022 than at any point since 1991!
- NCAA have a roster size in 2020 of 30.7, the most ever was 2013 with 31.1!
- There are more D1 wrestlers in 2020 than any point since 2011.
- There are more D2 wresters in 2020 than ever!
- D3 has the 2nd most wrestlers ever (3,124). Highest D3 ever was 1987 (3,279)

Is there an example in the NCAA of a limited/non-scholarship classification helping a sport grow?

Wrestling can Follow Football's Example of a Limited/Non-Scholarship Conference to Grow D1 Men's Wrestling.

- In 1978 Football divided D1 into 2 subcategories.
- They started 1A (FBS) and 1AA (FCS) to allow smaller, less funded programs to have competitive football in their classifications.
- 1AA has max of 63 scholarships (some conferences are lower than 63 or none. 1A has 85 scholarships.
- This allowed more schools to stay D1 and keep football.
- This decision allowed one of the two (until the 21st Century) male only sports to avoid the loss of teams.
- Football has continued to be the Big Man On Campus at many schools in all classifications.
- Football has increased 36% the number of D1 teams since 1981-82 to 2019. 1A decreased <6%> and 1AA increased 150% through 2019.
- Scholarships are huge portion of athletic budgets.
- Can anyone think of a coherent reason that Men's Wrestling should not follow this successful model on the D1 level?
- Men's Wrestling will still have 1 NCAA D1 championship tournament.
- A wrestling team must be the current classification of the member school (except for grandfathered schools).

How did football grow after the creation of 1AA football?

Football has grown on a D1 level since 1982 due to the creation of a limited and no scholarship division - 1AA/FCS

Does the champion of 1AA football conference go to the playoffs?

Football has a 1AA Non-Scholarship Conference - The Football only 11 Team Pioneer Conference.

- The Pioneer Conference qualifies for the 1AA Playoffs starting in 2013.
- Pioneer Conference has won Playoff games.
- San Diego beat Cal Poly on the road in first round game 35-21 in 2016.
- San Diego Beat 1AA Full scholarship on the road at Northern Arizona 41-10 in first round playoff game in 2017. That had to sting for Northern Arizona!
- Men's Wrestling Needs a Limited/Non-Scholarship Conference qualifying tournament where the 10 Champions advance to the NCAA D1 Championship Tournament.
- The Pioneer Conference has 11 schools from NY, SC, CA,MN, FL. All over the country. Including Presbyterian and Davidson.
- The Pioneer Conference has more Men's wrestling teams than the SEC in 2022.

Having a Limited/Non-Scholarship Conference will not be a logistical nightmare for Men's Wrestling.

- Football has overcome this argument. Schools are in football only conferences and a hybrid of conferences with affiliate members.
- Wrestling is a sport of wrestling only conferences (EIWA) and hybrid conferences.
- Big Ten is only Conference will complete membership.
- ACC is only other conference that does not have affiliate members.
- In 2020 wrestling had 58% schools that were affiliate members in the D1 Conference they qualified in.
- This number will grow as we add more teams, and more teams jump from D2 to D3.

Will limited/non-GIA schools have a chance in the Men's NCAA D1 Championships?

Only the Big 10 had more finalists in 2022 than the non-GIA lvies.

Will lower costs help grow wrestling?

The Laffer Curve Demonstrates how things Grow with Lower expenses.

- If we had less expensive teams, we would have more teams.
- Limited/Non-Scholarship D1 Conference would help grow Men's (and Women's) Wrestling on a D1 Level.
- · We have had trouble increasing D1 Men's Wrestling.
- MatStats is using a college education to help grow the sport.
- Many Colleges need more students. Many of these potential students are wrestlers that want to wrestle in college.
- Walmart is busy because of their low prices.

Uncle Sam Wants You to Grow Wrestling

- * Federal Financial Aid is Used in so many cases, let's augment a Limited/Non-Scholarship Conference with Uncle Sam.
- If a wrestler can not afford college, they turn to Federal or Institutional aid to help afford a college education.
- No reason to think they can't go to a college and wrestle that does not provide GIA's.

How much money would a college ask someone to donate/raise with full GIA's?

The Costs of a Full Scholarship Program are a Huge Barrier to Entry.
This is Hurting the NCAA D1 Team Numbers. A Limited/Non-Scholarship Conference could help us add Teams and Wrestlers.

How many college students get Financial Aid?

Wrestlers in a Limited/Non-Scholarship Program would pay for College Like Most Americans - Financial Aid.

- In 2019-20, Federal Financial Aid provides \$150B in aid to 13M students or about \$11,500/student in federal grant money.
- In 2019-20, Institutions provide \$71.1M in additional aid to 11.5M students or about \$6,182/student.
- In addition, more than 12M student get college loans.
- In all 86% of all college students get financial aid.
- Who cares where your free money comes from.
- Use Uncle Sam to help finance your education.
- Uncle Sam helping to grow Wrestling!!
