

The "current" state of affairs:

- For 2022-23, there were 79 schools with Division I wrestling programs, 77 of them are championship eligible.
- The seven conferences that serve as qualifying conferences, with 2022-23 qualifying teams are:
- Atlantic Coast (6)
- Big 12 (13 4 core, 9 affiliates)
- Big Ten (14)
- EIWA (17 single-sport conference)
- MAC (13 5 core, 8 affiliates)
- Pac-12 (6 3 core, 3 affiliates)
- SoCon (3 core, 6 affiliates)
- Lindenwood and Queens University of Charlotte are in their transitional period in reclassifying from NCAA Division II.
- Morgan State restarts competition in 2023-24.

- Moves that impact wrestling
- Campbell University left the big south for the colonial athletic association, the caa has since rebranded itself as the coastal athletic association.



• Big 12 expansion sucked Colorado back into the league, while the big ten poached Oregon and Washington from the pac-12. in the hours following that move, Arizona, **Arizona state** and Utah announced they would be joining the big 12.



Who is in limbo?

- Now what?
- The remnants of the pac-12 were Stanford, Oregon state, California and Washington state.
- Stanford and Oregon state are two of the three core members of the pac-12 wrestling conference.
- Their all-sports conference future is unclear, from a wrestling standpoint, it's also very unclear.





So for 2024-25, what could D1 wrestling look like?

The Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) is at six sponsoring schools with wrestling. There are rumors on social media that the acc is looking at the remaining four pac-12 schools as potential candidates, despite none of the four schools being anywhere near the Atlantic coast.

Let's entertain that alignment for a second.

ACC absorbs the remaining Pac-12.

Is Stanford to the Big Ten+ a more likely scenario? The Big Ten grabs Cal and Stanford to complete a 20-team super conference, complete with six schools on the Pacific Coast.



This would group Stanford into that mix and still leave Oregon State wrestling searching for a home.

OTHER SPORTS CONSIDERATIONS:

Stanford is the nation's top school in producing Olympians.

Football *COULD* survive as an independent.

Options being floated out include Stanford football going independent and its other sports looking for a more geographic home. Academically, there aren't too many options on the west coast.



A move to the Mountain West is clearly a geographic option (along with Oregon State), but a West Coast Conference (non-football Division I) conference might be an option, but it's definitely NOT lucrative in any form.

Exploring what happens if Stanford and Cal go Big Ten+

Highly unlikely that the remaining five (with Cal) would restart their wrestling programs.

Impact on the Big 12 Conference

- It's currently not known what Oklahoma plans to do with sports that aren't in the Southeastern Conference (SEC). After Missouri left for the SEC over a decade ago, wrestling found a home in the Mid-American Conference until the Big 12 let them back in as an affiliate.
- Arizona State would give the Big 12 four core schools (with Iowa State, Oklahoma State, West Virginia) with the sport. Is carrying 10 affiliates equitable to both the core schools?

WHY NOT CREATE A NEW QUALIFYING CONFERENCE?



The MOUNTAIN PACIFIC SPORTS FEDERATION is a conference that sponsors 11 sports where all its members have a primary all-sports conference elsewhere.

When it comes to competitive equity and like-funded schools, wrestling is all over the place. Half-funded schools competing with Power 5 programs is a band-aid for the sport's growth.

Of the schools that are currently in the Pac-12 and Big 12 for wrestling, five are currently affiliated with the MPSF in at least one sport, while four others were former members.


