There are more men at the worlds due to Fact that Women's Wrestling is still Relatively new to a good portion of the World.

There are 20% more wrestlers from 4% more countries in 2023 compared to the best (2019) of the previous 5 World Championships.

- 2023 1,042 wrestlers 2019 872 20% Increase
- 2023 99 countries 2019 95 4% Increase
- More wrestlers from More countries is great for the sport.
- There are 16 wrestlers per weight class at the Olympics, but there is not a limit for each weight at the Worlds as long as your country has an athlete at the Continental Championships.
- Gorms from MatStats has been proposing the NCAA has men and women at the same Championships at the same time and same arena. So, no surprise that Gorms is all for more wrestling.
