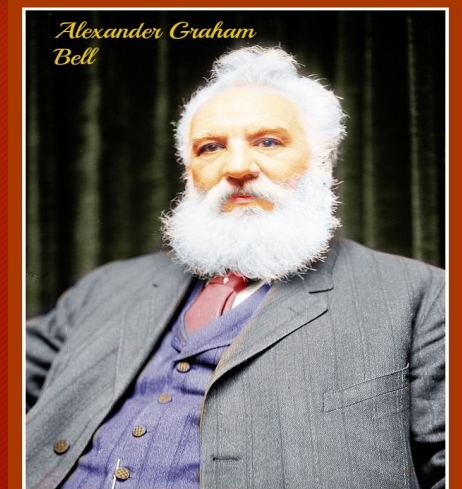

- MatStats is a subsidiary of the NWCA but is a separate entity that voices its own opinions on its statistical analysis.
 - MatStats three hosts, Gormley, Bryant, and Hazard are all equally responsible for all the good outcomes. Gormley for the bad feedback.

The Ivy League is leaving the EIWA in 2024-25.

- This was huge news in 12/2024.
- Shocking to many.
- Some even were like Chicken Little and thought the sky was falling.
- MatStats dives into the subject.
- MatStats shows the good points outweigh the downside.
- Gorms has always been a huge fan of the EIWA and needed to look at this as unbiased as possible. As always MatStats relies on stats to help educate the viewers.

How do the biggest stories in college sports pertain to the MatStats fans?

The biggest news in college sports in 2023 are off the field stories. Conference realignment, transfer portal, NIL, Coach Prime, illegal scouting, and upcoming expanded football playoffs.

- Only one of these topics has MatStats dealt with previously - Conference realignment.
- In December 2023, the Ivy League announced it would have its own qualifying tournament in 2025.
- This a huge story for collegiate wrestling. So big that we were originally planning on doing the January 2024 show on the number of matches wrestlers have had through the decades but have moved that show back on our calendar.
- This episode is dealing with the Ivy League going out on its own and what it might mean to college wrestling.
- MatStats is using its normal stat analysis and input from Jason and Kevin to help the viewers form a more educated opinion on this topic.

What is the big news in wrestling conference realignment?

The Ivy League is leaving the EIWA starting in 2025.

- We no longer have 17 members of the EIWA.
- That door closed.
- But a door to help the chances of growing NCAA D1 wrestling (men & women) might have been kicked open.

How about a quick history of the EIWA?

Ivy League (6 with wrestling) are for the first time in 2025 having their own tournament.

- The Ivy League schools started the EIWA tournament in 1905.
- There were 4 schools in the first EIWA's. All were Ivy League.
- The EIWA predates the formation of the Ivy League (1954).
- The 6 Ivy League schools will no longer be in the EIWA starting in 2024-25.
- The EIWA was the first collegiate wrestling conference.

How many schools have been in the EIWA since 1905? How many in 2024? 2025 after the Ivy's leave?

There have been 33 different schools in the EIWA. For 2024, there will be 17. In 2025, there will be 11 unless other changes are implemented.

Can MatStats provide a little Ivy League history for the viewers?

The Ivy League was formed in 1954. It has always had the same 8 schools.

- The Ivy League is 8 high academic colleges from the Northeast part of the country.
- 7 of these schools were formed before we were a country. Cornell started in 1865.
- The Ivy League has 7 of the 9 oldest colleges in America (W&M & Rutgers).
- The Ivy League was founded in 1954 with 8 schools. All 8 have always been members.
- Prior to 2000, they were some affiliated members in smaller sports mainly invitational formats.
- The total endowments of the Ivy League is \$188B.
- That would rank as the 58th largest GDP for a country in 2023 according to the IMF.
- The US Federal Budget in 1969 was \$183B.

Tell us about the Ivy League tournaments in other sports.

The Ivy League has traditionally been about regular season champions.

- The Ivy League did not have a conference basketball tourney to decide who went to the NCAA dances until 2017.
- They had the top 4 Men's & Women's teams in their tourney.
- All 6 games are the same weekend at the same on campus location.
- The Ivy League did not have baseball tourney until 2023.
- Since 1956, the wrestling team champion was decided based on dual meet standings.
- All 6 schools wrestle the other 5 schools every year.
- Hopefully having a wrestling tourney does not hurt the great dual meet tradition in the Ivy League.
- No other conference has this dual meet importance. It was a big story when Princeton ended Cornell's 17-year hold on the Ivy League dual meet championship in 2020.
- The Ivy League website has year by year dual meet standings dating back to 1956.

What is the most stable NCAA conference that has Men's D1 wrestling teams?

We learned in Episode #10, that the Ivy League is the **ONLY** conference (with men's wrestling) that has not gone through a realignment in the last 10 years.

Has MatStats dealt with conference realignment in previous shows?

Episode #10 (6/15/22), “*The Renovation of Men’s Division 1 Wrestling Conferences*” has addressed this possibility.

Episode
28-27

- On episode #10 (6/15/22), MatStats lead by Jason Bryant offered some suggestions for conference realignment.
- In this show Jason suggests the Ivy League being its own conference.
- Jason (Gorms & Hazard agree) that having more smaller conferences bring more conference champions, more meaningful dual meets, and a stronger possibility of the conferences adding some existing schools in that conference.
- No conference has a larger emphasis on their dual meets than the Ivy League.
- The EIWA rarely has a defined conference schedule.
- From 1985-86 to 1987-88, W&M had 7, 5, 6 dual meets with EIWA foes. Only two were just dual meets. The Tribe only had 2 home duals with EIWA teams.
- There were 16 teams in the EIWA those years.

The new EIWA is perfect for dual meets.

- The new EIWA will have 11 schools from 4 states + DC.
- The furthest west school is Bucknell (Lewisburg, PA).
- The furthest east school is Sacred Heart (Fairfield, CT).
- The furthest north school is Binghamton (Binghamton, NY).
- The furthest south school is USNA (Annapolis, MD).
- The longest trip is from Binghamton to USNA - 296 miles.
- These are short easy bus rides.
- Easy on the budgets and easier on the wrestlers.
- The new EIWA could have a dual meet regular season champion much easier than the current format.
- It is much easier to have a dual meet format with 11 teams than with 17 teams.

How many Men's sports does the Ivy League sponsor?

The Ivy League sponsors 16 men's sports. However, 2 of these (Wrestling & Ice Hockey) compete in other conferences (EIWA & ECAC Hockey).

Men's Wrestling & Men's Ice Hockey are sponsored by the Ivy League, but they are both affiliated with other conferences.

Perhaps having an Ivy League Wrestling qualifying tourney will increase the chances of Yale & Dartmouth adding men's wrestling.

Yale & Dartmouth do not have men's wrestling. Their endowments show they can afford a men's & women's wrestling teams. Perhaps the Ivy League now sponsoring wrestling will push them to starting teams again.

How many Ivy League sports do Yale & Dartmouth have as of 2024?

The chances of Yale & Dartmouth adding men's wrestling seems to increase since the Ivy's are going on their own.

- The Ivy League has 16 men's sponsored sports.
- 14 have are only in the Ivy League.
- Ice Hockey and Wrestling are in other conferences (ECAC Hockey & EIWA).
- The two Ivy League schools without men's wrestling are Yale & Dartmouth.
- Yale (Rowing) & Dartmouth (Fencing) have 14 of the 16 Ivy male sports.
- Men's rowing is not affiliated with the National Collegiate Athletic Association. The *de facto* national championship of Division I men's rowing is the Intercollegiate Rowing Association (IRA) Championships.

How many NCAA teams does rowing and fencing have compared to wrestling?

Men's wrestling has 5X as many NCAA teams as men's rowing and 8.4X as many NCAA teams as men's fencing.

NCAA D1 Men & Women is where our sport needs to grow.

- Men's NCAA D1 & Women's NCAA D1 have been the weak spot on the resurgence of wrestling this century.
- They (D1 wrestling) are only 4% of the new teams that still have wrestling this century.
- NCAA D1 tends to be large state schools that dominate Wrestling, Football, Basketball, & Baseball/Softball.
- There are some exceptions - Miami (FL), USC (CA), Vandy, Duke, Nova, Irish, etc.
- Wrestling is dominated by large state schools in the Big 10, Football in large state schools in the SEC.

Can MatStats provide the viewers with some ideas on why the new EIWA/Patriot League/Ivy should add women's wrestling.

- MatStats is here to provide numbers for our viewers and wrestling fans.
- Below is some ammunition to bring to schools in the new EIWA to help the schools make the correct decision to add women's wrestling.
- Many times, schools use stats/numbers that are inaccurate or unprovable when they turn their backs on adding wrestling.
- MatStats is happy to provide arrows to your quiver when stating your case to add wrestling.

How many girls row in high school?

No one knows for sure how many girls row in high school. So, the “facts” that some Patriot League school admins claim are not provable.

- In Juniorrowingnews.com on 12/10/21, Caleb Chiesa wrote, “Unfortunately, there is no vast study that provides an exact number on individual high school or collegiate rowers....”
- In 2023 the NFHS states there are 4 states, 49 schools, and 1,455 girls rowing.
- We learned in Episode 27 (12/20/23), *Rock ‘N’ Roll HS Part 2*, that there are 42 states that have sponsored girls HS wrestling.
- Since the NCAA reported in 2023 there are 6,707 female rowers in the NCAA, most collegiate girl's rowers come from clubs and not high schools.
- Travel and logistics works to have more girls wrestle in HS than row.

How many women row in the NCAA compared to wrestling?

The NCAA has **146/6,707** rowing teams/athletes and **97/1,464** women wrestlers/athletes.

Does MatStats have any recommendations for the viewers on how to best spend our energy?

Let's concentrate on making the sport better and growing the sport and not worrying about the Ivy League going its own way.

- The secret to change is to focus all of your energy not on fighting the old, but on building the new -Socrates
- MatStats is not claiming to have the answers for what teams might add men's or women's wrestling.
- We want teams in all divisions to add two wrestling teams.
- We are making suggestions based on analyzing the data which is what MatStats is all about.

Wrestling has been growing mainly from smaller private schools adding wrestling.

- As we learned in Episode 24 (10/18/23), “There is Something Happening Here...” and other previous shows, the growth of wrestling is smaller private schools.
- The Ivy League is all smaller private schools & The EIWA has only 3 state/federal schools.
- The Ivy League and the EIWA is a great hunting ground for potential women’s teams and more men’s teams.
- In lieu of complaining about the Ivy League going on its own, let’s take this opportunity to help grow the sport.

What different paths should the EIWA look into since the Ivy League is going on its own?

If the EIWA wants to add members it could investigate helping the addition of more NCAA D1 teams. It should also consider adding women.

- In the early days of the EIWA, they added teams when schools started wrestling teams.
- For years it was much like the conferences now. Other conferences (and regionals) were raided to keep membership numbers up.
- Now we need to look at growing the sport to growing the conference.
- Also add women's teams. This will take a mindset change and a lot of work.

NCAA D2 & D3 lead the growth in men's wrestling. D1 needs some stimulation.

Of the 16 men's sports that the Ivy League sponsors, how many have a female sport sponsored equivalent?

There are only 2 male sponsored sports in the Ivy League that do not have a female equivalent (Football & Wrestling).

- Football does not have a female equivalent. Wrestling does.
- As we previously saw on slide 28-7, as of 12/24/22, there are 143 colleges with women's wrestling.
- MatStats is hoping the Ivy League splitting away from the EIWA will push the Ivy League to start women's wrestling.
- We learned in many previous shows that wrestling was slow to have a female equivalent and that hurt our sport drastically.
- Now we have women wrestling in college.

Does MatStats have any free advice for the Ivy League?

OK Ivy League Boomers, start women's wrestling teams.

- The Ivy League schools are not short on money. \$188B total endowments.

- The first ever college football game on 11/6/1869 - Rutgers 6 Princeton 4.
- The oldest collegiate competition was in rowing in 1852 - Harvard vs Yale.

The Ivy League is a great place to look to grow our sport.

- When Gorms got to know Sally Roberts, founder of WLAG, Sally asked Gorms what conference would be good to pursue starting women's wrestling.
- Gorms immediately suggested the EIWA.
- This was in 2017 before we had 143 colleges with women's wrestling.
- Now that the Ivy League is splitting away from the EIWA, the Ivy League would be the best place to implement women's wrestling. Followed closely by the EIWA.
- The Ivy League should be easier since the 8 schools have been in the conference since 1954 with no changes in membership.
- The Ivy League schools have huge endowments.

Is the Ivy League leaving the EIWA good or bad?

The Ivy League leaving the EIWA has more potential upsides than downsides.

- Gorms has always been a big fan of the EIWA.
- MatStats does think the Ivy League going on its own could hurt the EIWA.
- But the Ivy League leaving could have many more positives than negatives.
- It could help D1 women's wrestling. We need help here.
- It could also help add more D1 men's wrestling teams.
- What would you rather have 17 EIWA men's teams or two conferences and a better chance to grow the sport?
- The formation of an Ivy League men's tournament will not affect the number of wrestlers in the Men's NCAA D1 tourney.
- With the new allocation system, the number of conference should not affect the overall people that qualify for the NCAA's.
- The good of the sport outweighs the number of EIWA teams.

- 1) As of 1/4/24, there are 502 NCAA & NAIA men's & women's teams.
- 2) The Ivies are leaving the EIWA in the 2024-25 season.
- 3) In 1905 the EIWA became the first collegiate wrestling conference. It started with 4 Ivy League schools (Columbia, Penn, Princeton, & Yale).
- 4) Since 2009 (controlling for 2021), the non-Ivy's had 57% of the NCAA bids in the EIWA. The Ivy League had 43%.
- 5) The EIWA is primarily a private school league (14). One state school & 2 federal schools.

- 6) The Ivy League is the only NCAA D1 conference that has no seen realignment in the past 10 years. The Ivy has been consistent since its inception in 1954.
- 7) Starting in the 2024-25 season the 11 EIWA schools will be set up nicely for dual meets with the longest distance between 2 schools at 296 miles.
- 8) Hopefully Yale & Dartmouth will reconsider wrestling as a men's varsity sport with the move to the traditional Ivy League.
- 9) D1 wrestling, men & women combined account for only 4% of NCAA & NAIA wrestling this century.
- 10) Both new qualifying conferences are fertile ground for growth going forward for women's wrestling.
